The House Of The Rising Sun	4:30	The Animals	Formed in Newcastle upon Tyne during 1962 and 1963, when Eric Burdon joined the Alan Price Rhythm and Blues Combo. The most successful commercial version of the song, reaching No 1 in 1964 in UK and US. Described as the "first folk-rock hit".
Backslap	2:33	Baby Earl & The Trinidads	
Jarrow Song	4:37	Alan Price	1974. Jarrow Crusade took place in October 1936 and was an organised protest against the unemployment and poverty suffered in the Tyneside town of Jarrow.
Apache	2:57	The Shadows	Hank Marvin and Bruce Welch were both born in Newcastle upon Tyne, 1941. They are the third most successful act in the UK singles chart, behind Elvis Presley and Cliff Richard. UK No. 1 in 1960 for 5 weeks.
Boat to Bolivia	4:03	Martin Stephenson and the Daintees	Band formed in Sunderland in 1982, Martin Stephenson from Durham. From their debut album of the same name, 1986. On Kitchenware Records, based in Newcastle upon Tyne.
Miss This Kiss	4:17	Hurrah	A British jangle pop band formed in Newcastle upon Tyne in the early 1980s and active until 1991. Also on Kitchenware Records.
Cruel	4:21	Prefab Sprout	An English pop band from Witton Gilbert, County Durham, who rose to fame during the 1980s. From their debut album Swoon, released 1984 on Kitchenware Records. Paddy McAloon was born in Durham and trained as a Catholic priest.
A lovely cup of tea	2:59	Young 'uns	In 2016, they picked up the "Best Group" award for the second consecutive year in the BBC Radio 2 Folk Awards. From Stockton, County Durham.
The Boat Race	2:02	The High Level Ranters	A Northumbrian traditional musical group founded in 1964, best known for being one of the first bands in the revival of the Northumbrian smallpipes. From album English Sporting Ballads, 1976.
Queen of Hearts	4:33	The Unthanks	From Last, their fourth album, 2011. Sisters Rachel and Becky Unthank grew up in Ryton, Tyne and Wear. Known for their eclectic approach in combining traditional English folk, particularly Northumbrian folk music, with other musical genres.
Ladytron	4:26	Roxy Music	Written by Bryan Ferry, appearing on Roxy Music's eponymous debut in 1972. Born in Washington, County Durham, 1945. He studied fine art at the University of Newcastle upon Tyne from 1964–68, under Richard Hamilton for one year.
The Bed's Too Big Without You	4:26	The Police	Gordon Matthew Thomas Sumner was born in 1951, in Wallsend, Northumberland. He taught at Cramlington School in Northumberland. This from their second album, Reggatta de Blanc, 1979, and was written by Sting.
Hounds Of Love	3:03	The Futureheads	Original from 1986, from Hounds of Love - Kate Bush's 5th album. The Futureheads are a post-punk band from Sunderland, covered the song in 2005, scoring a UK top 10 hit with it.
Disappointed	3:05	Field Music	Rock band from Sunderland, Tyne and Wear, that formed in 2004, their core consists of brothers David and Peter Brewis. This is from their latest album, Commontime, released last year.
Not So Manic Now	4:28	Dubstar	The group was formed in 1992 by Steve Hillier and Chris Wilkie in Newcastle-upon-Tyne. Sarah Blackwood joined in 1993, replacing Hillier on vocals. This reached No 18 in 1995.
Our Velocity	3:19	Maximo Park	The first single from Our Earthly Pleasures, the second album from the band, 2007. They formed in 2000 in Newcastle upon Tyne.
Do The Right Thing	3:44	Leatherface	A punk rock band from Sunderland, UK, fronted by Frankie Stubbs and formed in 1988. The Guardian has called them "the greatest British punk band of the modern era." From their fourth album, Minx, 1993.
Can't Get Enough of Your Love	4:16	Bad Company	From their 1974 self-titled debut album, it is their biggest hit. Formally a member of Free, Paul Bernard Rodgers is from Middlesbrough.
Thunderstruck	4:55	AC/DC	The lead single on the 1990 album The Razors Edge. In 1980, Brian Francis Johnson (from Gateshead) became the third lead singer of the Australian rock band AC/DC after the death of their second lead singer Bon Scott.
I'm An Upstart	2:19	Angelic Upstarts	English punk rock band that formed in South Shields in 1977. From debut album, Teenage Warning, 1979.
Don't Dictate	2:54	Penetration	Formed in County Durham, 1976, lead singer is Pauline Murray. The band took their name from an Iggy & The Stooges song. This is acknowledged as a classic punk rock single.
Run For Home	4:20	Lindisfarne	English folk rock and progressive rock band from Newcastle upon Tyne, established in 1968. From 1978 album, Back and Fourth.
Nellie The Elephant	3:00	Toy Dolls	English punk rock band formed in 1978 in Sunderland, Tyne and Wear. From their 1983 album Dig That Groove Baby, the song was originally written in 1956.
