	Lonely Boy	4:21	Andrew Gold	1977. Second verse of the song features backing vocals by Linda Ronstadt (for whom Gold had previously worked as a producer and backing musician). It follows the life of a child who feels neglected by his parents after the birth of a younger sister.
	Backslap	2:33	Baby Earl & The Trinidads	
	Amateur Hour	3:24	Sparks	Second single from their 1974 album Kimono My House.
	Long Cool Woman (In A Black Dress)	3:16	The Hollies	Co-writer Allan Clarke was only member left from original 60s lineup. On this 1972 release he imitated John Fogerty's vocal style, and was based on the Creedence song "Green River".
	Trampled under Foot	5:37	Led Zeppelin	Physical Graffiti - 1975, double album that includes unreleased tracks from earlier recording sessions: one outtake from Led Zeppelin III; three from Led Zeppelin IV; and three from Houses of the Holy including its unused title track
	Tangled Up In Blue	5:45	Bob Dylan	It appeared on his album Blood on the Tracks in 1975 and was released as a single. Rolling Stone ranked it #68 on their list of the 500 Greatest Songs of All Time. It deals with the changes he was going through, including his marriage falling apart.
	Groovin' With Mr Bloe	2:38	Mr Bloe	Includes Harry Pitch on harmonica, who died recently and Zack Laurence on piano. Harry performed the theme tune for Last of the Summer Wine. A favourite of Morrissey
	Blue Eyes Crying In The Rain [Alternative Take 2]	4:04	Elvis Presley	Recorded in the infamous Jungle Room in 1976.
	Low Rider (On The Boulevard)	3:10	War	1975, Lowrider - the Chicano culture practice of hydraulically hot-rodding classic cars
	Law of the land	4:54	The Temptations	Masterpiece is a 1973 album by The Temptations for the Motown label, produced and written by Norman Whitfield. The title track, at nearly 14 minutes long, includes only 3 minutes of vocals from the group.
	Homethoughts From Abroad	3:19	Clifford T. Ward	1973. Title taken from the poem "Home Thoughts from Abroad" by Robert Browning. Born in Stourport-on-Severn, Worcestershire, Ward was one of five children. In 1987, Ward was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis and died in 2001.
	Sundown	3:38	Gordon Lightfoot	Released as a single in 1974. Inspired by Lightfoot's then girlfriend, Cathy Smith, later more infamously known for her involvement in the 1982 drug-related death of actor John Belushi. He commented she was "the one woman in my life who hurt me most"
	Mrs. Vanderbilt	4:42	Paul McCartney & Wings	Band On The Run - Wings 3rd and most successful album, 1973 Opening lines are taken from the catchphrase of English music hall performer Charlie Chester.
	Time For Action	2:43	Secret Affair	1979, first single, reached 13. Had three UK Top 40 hits in 1979-80 in the wake of the success of mod rockers The Jam and the film Quadrophenia.
	On Your Radio	4:01	Joe Jackson	From I'm the Man album, his second, released in October 1979. Look Sharp was first, earlier in same year. 61 this week.
	Dusic	3:49	Brick	The band's final hit single on the Billboard Hot 100, peaking at #18 in 1977. R&B/funk band whose biggest hit was Dazz, their own term for disco-jazz, in 1976.
	Let's Start To Dance Again	4:43	Bohannon	Hamilton Frederick Bohannon, one of the leading figures in 1970s disco music. This, his biggest hit, from 1976
	I Love To Love	3:05	Tina Charles	Born Tina Hoskins. 1975. She was 22 when she recorded this, but had already been recording for seven years and had sung lead on an international hit: "I'm on Fire" by 5000 Volts (1975).
	Moonage Daydream	4:39	David Bowie	First released as a single with the band Arnold Corns. A re-recorded version, featuring Bowie and his backing band The Spiders from Mars, was released in 1972 on the album The Rise and Fall of Ziggy Stardust and the Spiders from Mars.
	Isn't It Time	4:03	The Babys	1977. Featured vocalist/bassist John Waite - who went on to have a hit with Missing You in 1984.
	My Oh My	4:38	Sad Café	Formed in Manchester in 1976, they had biggest success with Façades album in 1979. Frontman Paul Young went on to achieve greater chart success as the co-lead singer of Mike + The Mechanics.
	In a Broken Dream	3:41	Python Lee Jackson/ Rod Stewart	1970. Originally formed in Sydney in 1965, spotted by DJ John Peel whilst on tour in London. Peel brought Rod Stewart in for a session and recorded it. He was paid with a new set of seat covers for his car.
	She's A Lady	2:54	Tom Jones	Written by Paul Anka and released at the beginning of 1971.
	I Washed My Hands In Muddy Water	4:57	Elvis Presley	From Elvis Country, his 11th studio album, released in January 1971
