	Backslap	2:33	Baby Earl & The Trinidads	
	Dirty Boogie	2:51	Roy Hall and His Cohutta Mountain Boys	With it's relentless boogie-woogie style and no-holds-barred call-and-response vocals this was a big influence on rockabilly.
	Son Of A Preacher Man	2:29	Dusty Springfield	From 1968 album Dusty in Memphis. Song was originally offered to Aretha Franklin, who turned it down.
	Dust My Broom	2:54	Elmore James	Original by Robert Johnson in 1936, this version from 1951.
	Splish Splash	2:05	Bobby Darin	1958. The lyrics mention several characters from other songs of the period, including "Lollipop", "Peggy Sue", and "Good Golly Miss Molly".
	Kidney Stew Blues	2:58	Eddie "Cleanhead" Vinson	1947. Nicknamed Cleanhead after an incident in which his hair was accidentally destroyed by lye contained in a hair straightening product
	Rag Mop	2:52	Nellie Lutcher	1912-2007, At age 12, she played piano with Ma Rainey, credited as an influence by Nina Simone among others.
	House Cleaning	2:18	The Spaniels	Gerald Gregory with the deep voice.
	Jack That Cat Was Clean	3:32	Dr. Horse	Bobo, a character who spends on a \$100 on a necktie and wear \$1000 shirts (1950s prices)
	Dirty Laundry	5:37	Don Henley	From his debut solo album I Can't Stand Still, released in 1982. The song's theme is that TV news coverage focuses too much on negative and sensationalist news.
	Trash	2:14	Roxy Music	Single from 1979 album Manifesto
	Mirror In The Bathroom	3:03	The Beat	From their debut album, I Just Can't Stop It (1980). This song is often misinterpreted to be about cocaine, which is often consumed on mirrors brought into bathrooms.
	goo goo muck	3:07	The Cramps	From 1981 album, Psychedelic Jungle. Their second.
	I Washed My Hands In Muddy Water	4:57	Elvis Presley	From Elvis Country, his 11th studio album by Elvis Presley, released in January 1971
	Dirty Work	3:09	Steely Dan	Bit of an odd song in their repertoire - uncharacteristically emotional depiction of marital infidelity. From debut album, Can't Buy a Thrill, 1972. Only Steely Dan album to include David Palmer as a lead vocalist.
	A Song From Under The Floorboards	4:12	Magazine	From 'The Correct Use of Soap', their third album, released by Virgin Records in 1980.
	(I Was Born in A) Laundromat (Edit)	3:05	Camper Van Beethoven	1989, from Key Lime Pie, the band's final album before breaking up in 1990
	Dirty Water	2:49	The Standells	1966. Mocking city of Boston and its then-famously polluted Boston Harbor and Charles River.
	Dirty Ol' Man	3:14	The Three Degrees	Formed in 1963 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. A total of 15 women have been members over the years. 1973.
	Let's Clean Up The Ghetto	4:53	The Philadelphia All Stars	Issued in July 1977, one of Philly soul's most socially aware efforts. Features Lou Rawls, Billy Paul, Archie Bell, Teddy Pendergrass and The O'Jays as well as 3 Degrees
	Clean Up Woman	2:50	Betty Wright	Bessie Regina Norris, born 1953. This reached number 6 on the pop charts in 1972. Still active, brought out album 'Betty Wright: The Movie' in 2011.
	Car Wash	3:18	Rose Royce	1976, written and produced by Norman Whitfield, and was the group's debut single
	Funky Washing Machine	2:46	Alvin Cash	
	When I'm Cleaning Windows	2:55	George Formby	It first appeared in the 1936 film Keep Your Seats Please. Written by Fred Cliff, Harry Gifford and Formby. The song was so successful that George Formby recorded another version of the song entitled "The Window Cleaner (No. 2)".
