We Are England	3:32	Four Lions	England's unofficial anthem for Euro 2016. The Happy Mondays Shaun Ryder & Paul Oakenfold and Black Grape's Kermit and Goldie.
Mad Dogs And Englishmen	2:52	Noël Coward	Written by Noël Coward and first performed in New York in June 1931 by Beatrice Lillie.
Spanish Flea	2:12	Herb Alpert & The Tijuana Brass	1965, written by Julius Wechter with lyrics by Cissy Wechter. Original lyrics: There was a little spanish flea. A record star he thought he'd be. He heard of singers like Beetles and The Chipmunks he'd seen on TV. Why not a little spanish flea?
Istanbul (Not Constantinople)	2:21	The Four Lads	1953, Written on the 500th year anniversary of the fall of Constantinople to the Ottomans, the lyrics humorously refer to the official 1930 renaming of the city of Constantinople to Istanbul.
Here Is My Song For Europe	3:42	Denim	1992, from their debut album Back in Denim. Lawrence Hayward, known simply as Lawrence, a singer, songwriter and guitarist known as the frontman in the British alternative rock bands Felt, Denim and Go Kart Mozart.
All I Want For Christmas Is A Dukla Prague Away Kit	3:09	Half Man Half Biscuit	On The Trumpton Riots E.P., 1986. Dukla Prague disbanded in 1996 - and became FC Dukla Příbram. They reached the UEFA Cup Winners' Cup semi-final in 85-86.
London's Brilliant Parade	4:24	Elvis Costello	From Brutal Youth, 1994. This is the first album Costello recorded with his band the Attractions since Blood and Chocolate (1986).
Warsaw	2:26	Joy Division	About Opening song on their An Ideal for Living EP, 1978. About Rudolf Hess, a Nazi and Hitler's confidante. The chorus is a simple repetition of "31G", being the first three characters of his prisoner serial number.
The Paris Match	4:28	The Style Council - vocals by Tracey Thorn	Song from 1984 debut album, Café Bleu.
European Female	4:05	The Stranglers	1982, from the album Feline. Features bassist Jean-Jacques Burnel on lead vocals.
Nice 'N Sleazy	3:14	The Stranglers	From their third album Black and White, 1978. Produced by Martin Rushent. Album also contains a track called "Sweden (All Quiet on the Eastern Front)". A version sung in Swedish was released in Sweden.
Give Him A Ball (And A Yard Of Grass)	3:02	Sultans Of Ping FC	1993, from their debut album, Casual Sex in the Cineplex. Title is a quote from Brian Clough regarding his son Nigel.
The Rocky Road to Dublin	2:16	Liam Clancy	He was the youngest and last surviving member of the influential folk group the Clancy Brothers. Bob Dylan regarded him as the greatest ballad singer ever.
Back In The USSR	2:46	Chubby Checker	1969 cover, originally opening track on The White Album.
London Calling	3:20	The Clash	From third album, 1979.
White Car In Germany	5:31	The Associates	This was released in 1981 from the bands second album Fourth Drawer Down - it compiles the A- and B-sides from the six singles the band released that year on the label.
Girl From Germany	3:29	Sparks	1973, single released from from their second album, A Woofer in Tweeter's Clothing.
Midnight In Moscow	3:00	Kenny Ball & His Jazzmen	Reached no 2 in 1961. Originally called "Moscow Nights", first recored in 1956 by Vladimir Troshin. One of those best known Russian songs outside its homeland.
Pass! Shoot!! Goal!!!	3:16	Albert Whelan	Featured on compilation album: John Peel And Sheila: The Pig's Big 78s: A Beginner's Guide, consisting of music originally published on 78 rpm shellac records. This from 1931.
Never Been To Spain	3:27	Elvis Presley	Written by Hoyt Axton and orginally performed by Three Dog Night in 1971. This live version from 1972 As Recorded at Madison Square Garden. Hoyt's mother, Mae Boren Axton, co-wrote Heartbreak Hotel.
Europa Geht Durch Mich	3:24	Manic Street Preachers	From 2014 album, Futurology - their 12th. Featuring Nina Hoss, a German actress and singer.
I'm In Love With A German Filmstar	3:59	The Passions	1981, one hit wonders. Written by Barbara Gogan (singer) about Steve Connolly, a one-time roadie for The Clash and Sex Pistols and who had minor roles in several German films.
Alternative Ulster	2:45	Stiff Little Fingers	From 1979 debut album, Inflammable Material
