Backslop	2:33	Baby Earl & The Trinidads	
The Chicken	2:51	Rosco Gordon	Recorded at Sun Studios, 1955.
Milkcow Blues Boogie	2:38	Elvis Presley	Written and originally recorded by Sleepy John Estes in 1930. With Scotty Moore on guitar and Bill Black on bass, recorded at Sun late 1954.
Keep On Churnin' (Till The Butter Come)	2:54	Wynonie Harris	Born 1915, Wynonie Harris, born in Omaha, Nebraska, was an American blues shouter and rhythm and blues singer of upbeat songs, featuring humorous, often racy lyrics.
Holy Cow	2:33	Lee Dorsey	Reached no 6 in UK in 1966, written by Allen Toussaint with instrumental backing by the Meters.
Milk And Alcohol	2:51	Dr. Feelgood	Wilko Johnson left in 1977 - just before this, their biggest hit. Written by Nick Lowe and Gypie Mayo, who replaced Wilko on guitar.
Happy Boy	1:21	Beat Farmers	A cowpunk band which formed in San Diego, California in 1983 by Country Dick Montana, he died of a heart attack in 1995.
The Farmer Is The Man	1:42	Pete Seeger	Traditional American folksong, written in 1890s. Makes the point that ultimately, everyone lives off the farmer, because without him nobody eats. This from 1946.
Harvest Moon	5:03	Neil Young	From twentieth studio album, released in 1992. Many of the musicians appearing on it also appeared on his 1972 album Harvest.
Ready To Run	3:53	Dixie Chicks	The band is composed of founding members (and sisters) Martie Erwin Maguire and Emily Erwin Robison, and lead singer Natalie Maines.
Chicken Shack Boogie	2:30	Amos Milburn	1948 jump-boogie style song by West Coast blues artist Amos Milburn. It was the first of his four number-one hits on the R&B chart.
The Chicken And The Hawk	2:40	Big Joe Turner	1956, written by Jerry Leiber and Mike Stoller
Paddy Mcgintys Goat	2:32	Val Doonican	Released on the Decca label as the B Side of "Delaney's Donkey". Although it failed to chart, it became one of the song's most readily associated with Doonican during his five decade plus career.
Farmer John	1:59	The Searchers	1963, from their first album Meet the Searchers. Original by Don & Dewey, 1959. Album also featured Love Potion Number Nine - original by The Coasters
I'm A Hog For You	2:01	The Coasters	B side of Poison Ivy, 1959, written by Jerry Leiber and Mike Stoller
Po Fasis - A Roll With It	2:32	The Shirehorses	Comprising two BBC Radio DJs from Manchester, Mark Radcliffe and Marc Riley, known collectively as Mark and Lard.
Chicken Payback	3:15	The Bees	
Crazy Horses	2:32	The Osmonds	November 1972. A protest about the amount of pollution created by cars.
Papa's Got A Brand New Pigbag	3:37	Pigbag	The title being a clear pun on James Brown's song.
sheep	2:16	The Housemartins	1986, 2nd single from album London 0 Hull 4.
me and the farmer	2:54	The Housemartins	1987 single from The People Who Grinned Themselves to Death albym
Love On A Farmboy's Wages	3:59	XTC	1983. From Swindon, England, led by songwriters Andy Partridge and Colin Moulding and active between 1976 and 2005, but retired from live performance in 1982.
Muck It Out!	3:24	The Farmer's Boys	From Norwich, formed in the early 1980s and were briefly called 'Bang Goes My Stereo' before changing their name. This reached no 48 in 1983.
You're A Humdinger	2:36	Farmer Boys	1955, first single from American country music duo consisting of Bobby Adamson and Woody Murray
King Horse	3:01	Elvis Costello	
cotton fields	2:57	Creedence Clearwater Revival	Written by Huddie Ledbetter, better known as Lead Belly, who made the first recording of the song in 1940. This from 1969 album Willy and the Poor Boys.
Let's Do It (The Chicken Scratch)	2:41	Jimmy Cracklin	Biggest hit was The Walk in 1957
Harvest For The World	3:55	The Isley Brothers	1976, title track from their fourteenth album
Do The Funky Chicken	3:15	Rufus Thomas	1969 on Stax Records
No Milk Today	2:52	Herman's Hermits	
Cow Cow Boogie	2:54	Ella Fitzgerald	Written for the 1942 Abbott & Costello film Ride 'Em Cowboy, which included Ella Fitzgerald as a cast member
