	This Is Pop?	2:44	XTC	Written by Andy Partridge released as a single in 1977, produced by Mr Shania Twain, 'Mutt' Lange.
	Backstop	2:33	Baby Earl & The Trinidads	
	The King Is Half-Undressed	3:46	Jellyfish	A power pop band from San Francisco. 1990, from their debut album Bellybutton. Although their career was short, the band has become highly influential in the power pop genre.
	I Saw The Light	3:00	Todd Rundgren	Opening track from his 1972 Something/Anything? double album. He intended the song to be the hit of the album, and copied the Motown tradition of putting hit songs at the beginning of the album.
	Driver's Seat	4:00	Sniff 'N' The Tears	Their one-hit wonder from 1979. According to singer Paul Roberts, it isn't about driving, but rather "fragmented, conflicting thoughts and emotions that might follow the break-up of a relationship". Featured in 1997 film Boogie Nights.
	When My Baby's Beside Me	3:24	Big Star	1972, from their debut album 'Number 1 Record'. Critically praised but suffered from poor distribution and sold fewer than 10,000 copies.
	Isn't It Time	3:51	The Babys	1977. Featured vocalist/bassist John Waite - who went on to have a hit with Missing You in 1984.
	Is She Really Going Out With Him?	3:36	Joe Jackson	1979, his first single and was included on his debut album, Look Sharp!. Born in Burton upon Trent, 1954.
	Echo Beach	3:34	Martha & The Muffins	Formed in Toronto. 1980, from their debut album Metro Music. It does not refer to a real beach but is rather a symbolic notion of somewhere the narrator would rather be.
	My Best Friend's Girl	3:45	The Cars	From self-titled debut album, released in 1978
	Airport	4:29	Motors	Reached number 4 in 1978. Nick Garvey, vocals/guitar, was born in Stoke on Trent. Band also featured Bram Tchaikovsky on guitar.
	Over Night Sensation	5:24	Raspberries	From Cleveland, Ohio, includes Eric Carmen on vocals and guitar. 1974.
	I Want You To Want Me	3:34	Cheap Trick	1978, recorded for the group's most popular album, Cheap Trick at Budokan.
	Someday, Someway	2:48	Marshall Crenshaw	1982, from self-titled debut album. Rolling Stone included the album in their list of "The 100 Best Albums of the Eighties", coming in at 72.
	Going down to Liverpool	3:41	Bangles	Original by Katrina and The Waves, 1982. Bangles second single, 1985 (got to 79) one of only two singles with Debbi Peterson on lead vocals. Video features the band inside a car being driven around by a chauffeur - played by Leonard Nimoy.
	Girlfriend	3:41	Matthew Sweet	1991, from his third album Girlfriend, recorded after he was divorced.
	Eloise	5:41	Barry Ryan	1968, written by his twin brother Paul Ryan. The Damned had their biggest hit with a cover version in 1986.
	Starry Eyes	4:18	The Records	From 1979 debut album Shades in Bed. They formed out of the ashes of the Kursaal Flyers, a pub rock group featuring drummer Will Birch.
	My Sharona	4:02	The Knack	1979 debut single. It was Capitol Records' fastest selling debut single in the US since the Beatles' "I Want to Hold Your Hand" in 1964. Sharona Alperin was girlfriend of lead singer Doug Fieger - she appears on the single's picture sleeve.
	Whole Wide World	3:00	Wreckless Eric	1977 on Stiff Records. Produced by, and featured bass guitar (and most of the other instruments) by Nick Lowe.
	I Got You	3:29	Split Enz	From 1979 album True Colours. Written by Neil Finn, it was their most commercially successful single.
	We Got The Beat	2:30	The Go-Go's	1980, written by the group's lead guitarist and keyboardist Charlotte Caffey.
	Back Of My Hand	3:20	Jags	Entered the UK Singles Chart on 8 September 1979 and peaked at number 17.
	Another Girl Another Planet	3:00	The Only Ones	Second track on their first album, The Only Ones, released in 1978. Placed at number 18 in John Peel's all-time Festive Fifty.
	Trouble With Love	3:30	Any Trouble	Founding members were Clive Gregson, Chris Parks and Tom Jackson met at Crewe and Alsager Teacher Training College in 1974. This from 1981.
