	Top Of The Pops	2:58	The Rezillos	Formed in Edinburgh in 1976, described themselves as "a New Wave beat group". Jo Callis was a founding member - went on to join Human League, he plays guitar on this. 1978, from their only studio album 'Can't Stand the Rezillos'.
	Backslap	2:33	Baby Earl & The Trinidads	
	This Is Pop?	2:44	XTC	Written by Andy Partridge released as a single in 1977, produced by the man who had no idea that he was going to end up as Mr Shania Twain, 'Mutt' Lange.
	The Day The World Turned Day-Glo	2:52	X-Ray Spex	From debut album 'Germfree Adolescents', 1978. In 1994, The Guinness Encyclopedia of Popular Music named it the 8th best punk album of all-time.
	Read About Seymour	1:27	Swell Maps	Experimental DIY rock group of the 1970s from Birmingham. Consisting of brothers Epic Soundtracks (real name Kevin Paul Godfrey) and Nikki Sudden (Adrian Nicholas Godfrey). Debut single from 1977.
	Part Time Punks	2:36	Television Personalities	The only constant member is singer-songwriter Dan Treacy. 1978, from their second EP Where's Bill Grundy Now?
	King Rocker	2:17	Generation X	About John Lennon and Paul McCartney having a fight with Elvis about who was the king of rock and roll. 1978, from second album Valley of the Dolls which was produced by Ian Hunter.
	Holidays In The Sun	3:20	Sex Pistols	1977, the band's fourth single and last one with John Lydon on vocals. "No One Is Innocent" with Ronnie Biggs was follow up single.
	Pulled Up	4:37	Talking Heads	From debut album '77', written and composed by David Byrne.
	Take Me I'm Yours	2:51	Squeeze	1978, from first album 'Squeeze'.
	Jimmy Jimmy	2:34	Undertones	Written by the band's main songwriter, John O'Neill, in 1979. About a suicide delivered with a sense of optimism.
	I Heard it Through the Grapevine	4:01	The Slits	B side of first single 'Typical Girls' in 1979. Originally recorded by Smokey Robinson & the Miracles in 1966 but rejected (as was the Marvin Gaye version) by Berry Gordy in favour of Gladys Knight & the Pips version in 1967.
	Happy House	3:53	Siouxsie And The Banshees	1980, first single from the their third album, Kaleidoscope. This period saw the arrival of two new musicians: drummer Budgie, previously of The Slits, and guitarist John McGeoch, previously of Magazine.
	Another Girl, Another Planet	3:03	The Only Ones	Often considered a one-hit wonder, the track was not a chart hit on its initial release in 1978, and actually never was a bit hit. Appeared on compilation album, Sound of the Suburbs and was on UK Singles Chart for two weeks, peaking at No. 57 in 1992.
	Jilted John	2:59	Jilted John	Graham David Fellows, English comedy actor and musician, best known for creating the characters of John Shuttleworth and Jilted John. 1978, Produced by Martin Hannett (Joy Division), the song was first played on national radio by John Peel.
	Young Savage	3:00	Ultravox!	1977, with John Foxx on vocals - before the arrival of Midge Ure when they dropped the exclamation mark in their name. Suede's Brett Anderson described it as 'really exciting - glammy, pinky, violent.'
	Fragile	1:19	Wire	From debut and widely acclaimed studio album, Pink Flag, released in December 1977 through Harvest Records.
	Do You Believe In The Westworld	3:50	Theatre Of Hate	Led by singer-songwriter and ex-member of punk band The Pack, Kirk Brandon. Reached no. 40 in 1982.
	California Uber Alles	3:28	Dead Kennedys	Appeared on their first album Fresh Fruit for Rotting Vegetables in 1980. A satirical attack on Jerry Brown, the Governor of California from 1975-1983.
	Is Vic There	3:05	Department S	Debut single, 1981
	Jocko Homo	3:22	Devo	Title is taken from a 1924 anti-evolution essay called Jocko-Homo Heavenbound by B. H. Shaddock, a satirical view of devolution. B-side of Devo's first single, "Mongoloid", 1977
	Airport	4:29	Motors	Reached number 4 in 1978. Nick Garvey, vocals/guitar, was born in Stoke on Trent. Band also featured Bram Tchaikovsky on guitar.
	Suspect Device	2:44	Stiff Little Fingers	They formed in 1977, at the height of the Troubles. They started out as a schoolboy band called Highway Star (named after the Deep Purple song), doing rock covers. Debut single, 1979.
	In A Rut	3:13	The Ruts	Debut single, 1978. Singer Malcolm Owen was found dead in the bathroom of his parents' house from a heroin overdose on 14 July 1980 at the age of 26.
	Bankrobber	4:34	The Clash	1980 single, not released on any of their studio albums
