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| | Here Comes Summer | 2:10 | Jerry Keller | 1959, written and performed by Keller, No. 1 for one week in the UK Singles Chart and was his only hit. |
| | Backslop | 2:33 | Baby Earl & The Trinidads | |
| | Good Day Sunshine | 2:12 | The Beatles | From 1966 album Revolver. George Martin is responsible for the slowed-down honky-tonk piano solo that follows the second verse. |
| | Summertime | 2:42 | Billy Stewart | An aria composed by George Gershwin for the 1935 opera Porgy and Bess. This is most commercially successful version, reached no 10 in US in 1966. |
| | Sundown | 3:38 | Gordon Lightfoot | Released as a single in 1974. Inspired by Lightfoot's then girlfriend, Cathy Smith, later more infamously known for her involvement in the 1982 drug-related death of actor John Belushi. He commented she was "the one woman in my life who hurt me most" |
| | Summer Fun | 3:13 | Barracudas | English-Canadian band that formed in the late 1970s. Reached number 37 in the UK Singles Chart in 1980. |
| | Summertime City | 3:37 | Mike Batt | Theme from Seaside Special which ran from 1975-79. This was a UK Top 10 hit in 75. Little and Large, Keith Harris and Orville, Showaddywaddy, The Wurzels all featured. |
| | Who Loves The Sun | 2:44 | The Velvet Underground | 1970, from Loaded, their fourth studio album. It was the final album recorded featuring Lou Reed. |
| | Summer in the City | 2:41 | The Lovin' Spoonful | 1966. The song features a series of car horns during the instrumental bridge, starting with a Volkswagen Beetle horn. |
| | Waking Up In The Sun | 3:58 | The Adult Net | A British-based American singer and guitarist Brix Smith in 1985 while she was a member of The Fall. This reached number 95 in the UK in 1986. |
| | The Other Side of Summer | 3:56 | Elvis Costello | Single from 1991 album Mighty Like A Rose. A Beach Boys pastiche, the song featured a Wall of Sound production - two basses, two guitars and many keyboard tracks. |
| | All Summer Long | 2:07 | The Beach Boys | Written by Brian Wilson and Mike Love and was released on their 1964 album All Summer Long. |
| | The Warmth Of The Sun | 2:52 | The Beach Boys | Written by Brian Wilson and Mike Love and was released on their 1964 album Shut Down Volume 2 and as the B-side of the "Dance, Dance, Dance" |
| | California Sun | 2:22 | The Rivas | Originally performed by Joe Jones in 1961, this from 1964. Hailed as the last American rock and roll hit before the British Invasion. |
| | Blister In The Sun | 2:26 | Violent Femmes | 1983. The Milwaukee band were probably singing about heroin addiction, featured on the soundtrack to Grosse Pointe Blank featuring John Cusack. |
| | Summer | 2:27 | Skids | Produced by Tony Wilson for John Peel Session 19/2/79. |
| | Holidays In The Sun | 3:20 | Sex Pistols | 1977, the band's fourth single and last one with John Lydon on vocals. "No One Is Innocent" with Ronnie Biggs was follow up single. |
| | Here Comes the Summer | 1:45 | The Undertones | Inspired by Ramones and written in 1978 by the band's main songwriter, John O'Neill |
| | Always the Sun | 4:07 | The Stranglers | Released as a single in 1986, the second single from the album Dreamtime. Only reached number 30 in the UK Singles Chart |
| | Staying Out For The Summer | 3:14 | Dodgy | From Homegrown, their second album, released in 1994. |
| | Hot Fun in the Summertime | 2:39 | Sly & the Family Stone | Released in 1969, in the wake of the band's high-profile performance at Woodstock. Covered by the Beach Boys on their 1992 album Summer in Paradise. |
| | Walking On Sunshine | 4:44 | Rockers Revenge Ft. Donnie Calvin | Written by Eddy Grant and was released by him in 1979, but not a hit. Rockers Revenge was a studio project assembled by producer Arthur Baker with vocals by Donnie Calvin in 1982 |
| | Morning Sun | 2:56 | Al Barr & The Cimarons | Featured on This Is England soundtrack, 2006 British drama film written and directed by Shane Meadows. The story centres on young skinheads in England in 1983. |
| | So Is The Sun | 2:48 | World Column | 1969. Appears to be their only single. |
| | Summer Breeze | 3:07 | The Isley Brothers | Written and first recorded by Seals and Crofts in 1972. Covered in a harder rock/soulful style by The Isley Brothers as a single in 1974. |
| | Summer People | 4:02 | Webb Brothers | Christiaan, Justin, and James Webb are sons of the songwriter Jimmy Webb. |
| | Automatically Sunshine | 2:37 | The Supremes | 1972, written by Smokey Robinson. Lead vocals by Mary Wilson and Jean Terrell. |
| | Summer Song | 3:46 | Louis Armstrong and Dave Brubeck | From The Real Ambassadors, a jazz musical developed in the late 1950s and early 1960s by Dave Brubeck, in collaboration with Louis Armstrong and his band. |
| | Bring Me Sunshine | 1:51 | Morcambe & Wise | Written in 1966 by the composer Arthur Kent, with lyrics by Sylvia Dee. M&W adopted as their signature tune for their second BBC series, 1969 |
