	Backslop	2:33	Baby Earl & The Trinidads	
	Route 66	2:38	Bobby Troup	Composed in 1946 by Bobby Troup. It was first recorded in the same year by Nat King Cole. Covered by many artists including Chuck Berry in 1961 and The Rolling Stones in 1964.
	Big Train (From Memphis)	2:58	John Fogerty	1984, from his 3rd solo album, Centerfield. All instruments, vocals, production and arrangement done by John Fogerty.
	Viva Las Vegas	2:26	Elvis Presley	From 1964 film starring Elvis and Ann-Margret.
	Hawaii Five-O	1:53	The Ventures	The show originally aired for 12 seasons, from 1968 to 1980. The group is the best-selling instrumental band of all time
	Panic in Detroit	4:29	David Bowie	From the album Aladdin Sane, 1973. Interpreted as being written about the 1967 Detroit riots.
	Jenny Take a Ride	3:23	Mitch Ryder & the Detroit Wheels	1965.
	Jackson	2:47	Nancy Sinatra & Lee Hazelwood	Written in 1963 by Billy Edd Wheeler and Jerry Leiber and first recorded by Wheeler. This from 1967. Also a country hit single by Johnny Cash and June Carter, recorded 6 months previously.
	Mississippi Delta	3:08	Bobbie Gentry	
	The Devil Went Down To Georgia	3:36	The Charlie Daniels Band	1979, their biggest hit. Musical references to traditional American folk songs - "Fire on the Mountain", "The House of the Rising Sun", "Chicken in the bread pan pickin' out dough" and "Granny does your dog bite?"
	Wichita Lineman	3:04	Glen Campbell	Written by Jimmy Webb in 1968. Wichita is the largest city in the State of Kansas.
	By The Time I Get To Phoenix	3:40	Nick Cave & The Bad Seeds	1965, also written by Webb and made famous by Campbell. Nick's version is from 1986 album of cover versions, Kicking Against the Pricks.
	Virginia Plain	3:00	Roxy Music	Their debut single in August 1972. Title "Virginia Plain" from one of Ferry's own paintings, featuring an image of cigarette packaging
	25 Or 6 To 4	4:51	Chicago	1970. Reference to the time of day - 3:35am or 3:34am
	Ohio	3:02	Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young	Reaction to the Kent State shootings of May 4, 1970 - shooting of unarmed college students by the Ohio National Guard, 4 were killed. They had been protesting against US invasion of Cambodia and the Vietnam War in general.
	Jet Boy	4:40	New York Dolls	Along with the Velvet Underground and the Stooges, they were one of the first US bands in the early punk rock scene. 1973
	Phoenix City	3:02	Roland Alphonso & The Soul Brothers	A Jamaican tenor saxophonist, and one of the founding members of the Skatalites, which disbanded in 1965
	The Boy From New York City	2:59	The Ad Libs	1965. Darts did a version in 1978, reached no 2.
	Nutbush City Limits	2:58	Ike & Tina Turner	1973, the last hit single the duo would produce together - they split shortly after. Birthplace of Anna Mae Bullock - Nutbush, Tennessee.
	Kentucky Woman	2:26	Neil Diamond	1967, written and originally recorded by Neil Diamond. Covered in 1968 by Deep Purple.
	King Of The New York Streets	4:48	Dion	1989, Dion Francis DiMucci
	Native New Yorker	3:26	Odyssey	1977. The tenor saxophone solo is played by Michael Brecker.
	Theme From New York, New York	3:25	Frank Sinatra	Theme song from the Martin Scorsese film New York, New York, performed in the film by Liza Minnelli. Sinatra's version 1979.
