Noel	Don't Play That Song	3:43	Aretha Franklin	From 1970 album 'Spirit in the Dark', one of Aretha's classic Atlantic Records, song first recorded by soul singer Ben E. King
	Backslop	2:33	Baby Earl & The Trinidads	
Noel	Sent For You Yesterday And Here You Come Today	3:36	Count Basie & The Mills Brothers	Originally recorded by Count Basie and His Orchestra in 1938. This from 1968 album The Board of Directors Annual Report recorded with The Mill Brothers.
Dean	Big Ten Inch Record	2:12	Bullmoose Jackson	1919 - 1989. Sometimes considered a performer of dirty blues, because of the suggestive nature of some of his songs, such as this and "I Want a Bowlegged Woman". 1952, written by Jerry Leiber and Mike Stoller.
Dean	Big Train (From Memphis)	2:58	John Fogerty	1984, from his 3rd solo album, Centerfield. All instruments, vocals, production and arrangement done by John Fogerty.
Dom	Brooklyn (Owes the Charmer Under Me)	4:21	Steely Dan	From Can't Buy a Thrill, 1972. Vocal by David Palmer.
Dom	Life In Tokyo (Part 1)	4:01	Japan	1979, a collaboration with disco producer Giorgio Moroder, who also co-wrote the song with David Sylvian. The B-side, "Life In Tokyo Theme" is a slowed down mix which could be enjoyed at the usual speed if played on a 78rpm turntable.
Noel	Stranger In My Own Home Town	4:24	Elvis Presley	From 1969 album Back In Memphis. Written by Percy Mayfield.
Dean	Little Sister	3:49	Ry Cooder	Written by Doc Pomus and Mort Shuman, originally by Elvis in 1961. This from 1979's Bop till You Drop, which consists almost entirely of covers of earlier rhythm and blues and rock and roll classics.
Noel	Barefootin'	2:35	Robert Parker	Reached number 24 in the UK Singles Chart in 1966. He started his career as a saxophonist, playing with Professor Longhair on his hit "Mardi Gras In New Orleans" in 1949.
Dom	Moonage Daydream	4:43	David Bowie	First released as a single with the band Arnold Corns. A re-recorded version, featuring Bowie and his backing band The Spiders from Mars, was released in 1972 on the album The Rise and Fall of Ziggy Stardust and the Spiders from Mars.
Dom	Sail On, Sailor	3:20	The Beach Boys	Recorded for the 1973 album Holland. Vocals by Blondie Chaplin, who was a member for only a short while.
Dean	Sea Cruise	2:45	Frankie Ford	1959. The song was originally recorded by Huey Smith and the Clowns, but Frankie Ford's lead vocal replaced Huey Smith's while the group was on tour. It was credited to Frankie Ford with Huey "Piano" Smith and The Clowns.
Dean	Radar Love	3:44	Golden Earring	Dutch rock band Golden Earring. 1973 - reached no 7, their only single to chart in UK.
Noel	Thirteen	2:35	Big Star	Rolling Stone magazine describes it "one of rock's most beautiful celebrations of adolescence" Written by Alex Chilton and Chris Bell. Originally featured on the 1972 album #1 Record.
Dom	Distant Past	3:44	Everything Everything	2014, the lead single from the band's third studio album, Get to Heaven. The track features a bridge scanner sound from the original Star Trek TV show.
Dean	Convoy	3:50	C.W. McCall	It's success in 1975 helped start a fad for citizens band (CB) radio. The song was the inspiration for the 1978 Sam Peckinpah film Convoy.
Noel	Keep On Truckin' (Part 1)	3:33	Eddie Kendricks	1973, his first major hit as a solo artist, coming two years after his departure from The Temptations. Co-written by Frank Wilson (Do I Love You?). One of the first records to be called 'Disco'.
Dean	Dixie Chicken	3:59	Little Feat	1973, from 3rd album 'Dixie Chicken'. The country group The Dixie Chicks took their name from this song.
Dean	Joy Division Oven Gloves	3:11	Half Man Half Biscuit	From Achtung Bono, their tenth album, released in 2005. This got to No. 6 in the UK Singles Chart in 2010 as part of the protest against the threatened closure of BBC 6 Music.
Noel	Swing Your Daddy	2:53	Jim Gilstrap	1975, his best known single. In the early 1970s, Gilstrap was one of the backing vocalists for Stevie Wonder, appearing his albums Talking Book and Innervisions.
Dom	Must I Paint You a Picture	5:33	Billy Bragg	From 1988 album Workers Playtime and reached number 18 in the UK albums chart.
Dom	Outdoor Miner	2:51	Wire	1979, from Chairs Missing, their second studio album. Single was a minor hit, peaking at number 51 in the UK singles chart.
Noel	Little Ole Wine Drinker, Me	2:48	Dean Martin	Frst released by Charlie Walker in 1966, it became a hit when it was released by Robert Mitchum in early 1967, and by Dean Martin later the same year on his album Welcome to My World.
Noel	Goodnight Sweetheart, Goodnight	2:40	The Spaniels	A hit in 1954 - the best-selling version of the song was recorded by the McGuire Sisters in the same year.
