About The Weather	3:27	Magazine	1981, from their 4th album Magic, Murder and the Weather.
Backslap	2:33	Baby Earl & The Trinidads	
Stormy Weather	2:32	The Spaniels	Written in 1933 by Harold Arlen and Ted Koehler. Ethel Waters first sang it at The Cotton Club night club in Harlem in 1933. This from 1958.
Raining In My Heart	2:50	Buddy Holly	Music and lyrics are written by the songwriting team of Felice Bryant and Boudleaux Bryant. It was released as a single on Coral Records in 1959, peaking at no 88 on the Billboard charts as the B-side of "It Doesn't Matter Anymore"
Such Sweet Thunder (Cleo)	3:22	Duke Ellington and his Orchestra	Released in 1957. The album is a 12 part suite based on the work of William Shakespeare.
You Are My Sunshine	3:01	Ray Charles	First recorded in 1939, originally by former state governor and country music singer Jimmie Davis. This from Modern Sounds in Country and Western Music, 1962 - a landmark album in American music
Who'll Stop The Rain	2:28	Creedence Clearwater Revival	Written by John Fogerty for their 1970 album Cosmo's Factory. A thinly veiled protest against the Vietnam War
Rain	2:59	Terence Trent D'Arby	Sananda Francesco Maitreya (born Terence Trent Howard in New York, 1962). 1987, from his debut album Introducing the Hardline According to Terence Trent D'Arby.
Wild Is The Wind	2:25	Johnny Mathis	Written by Dimitri Tiomkin and Ned Washington, originally recorded by Johnny Mathis for the 1957 film Wild Is the Wind. David Bowie did a version on 1976 album Station to Station.
Kentucky Rain	3:16	Elvis Presley	Hit in 1970, written by Eddie Rabbitt and Dick Heard. Recorded at American Sound Studio, Memphis.
A Hard Rain's A-Gonna Fall	5:19	Bryan Ferry	Written by Bob Dylan in the summer of 1962 for his second album The Freewheelin' Bob Dylan. This from Ferry's debut album These Foolish Things, 1973, which consists entirely of cover versions.
Blowin' In The Wind	3:06	Stevie Wonder	Also originally from The Freewheelin' Bob Dylan album. This a top ten in 1966.
I Can't Stand The Rain	2:33	Ann Peebles	1973. One of John Lennon's favorite songs (he commented, "It's the best song ever.") and Ian Dury chose this song as one of his eight songs when he appeared on Desert Island Discs. Eruption did a disco version in 1978.
Down Came The Rain	3:32	Mister Murray	1965. As Mitch Murray he wrote Even the Bad Times are Good, The Ballad of Bonnie and Clyde, Hitchin' a Ride, Avenues and Alleyways and I Did What I Did for Maria
Here Comes the Summer	1:45	The Undertones	Inspired by Ramones and written in 1978 by the band's main songwriter, John O'Neill
Cloudy Day	3:17	Finis Tasby	Los Angeles based blues singer and frontman for the group The Mannish Boys. From Ace Records compilation Shattered Dreams - Funky Blues 1967-1978
Little Fluffy Clouds	4:02	The Orb	Released by the ambient house group The Orb in 1990 and peaked at no 87 on the UK Singles Chart - got to no 10 when re-released in 1993. Uses clips from an interview with Rickie Lee Jones in which she recalls images of her childhood.
Summer Breeze	3:07	The Isley Brothers	Written and first recorded by Seals and Crofts in 1972. Covered in a harder rock/soulful style by The Isley Brothers as a single in 1974.
Sunny	2:44	Bobby Hebb	Written by Bobby Hebb in 1966. It is one of the most performed and recorded popular songs, with hundreds of versions released - including Stevie Wonder, Ella Fitzgerald, The Four Seasons, The Four Tops, Marvin Gaye, Dusty Springfield and Boney M.
Gale Force Wind	3:31	Microdisney	Irish musical duo, formed in 1980 by Cathal Coughlan (keyboards, vocals) and Sean O'Hagan (guitar). This was their final single, from 1988 reached no 98
Tinseltown in the Rain	5:54	The Blue Nile	Formed in 1981 by Paul Buchanan and Robert Bell in Glasgow. From their debut album A Walk Across the Rooftops, 1984.
Things Behind the Sun	3:57	Nick Drake	From Pink Moon, his third and final studio album, 1972. Released two years before his death at the age of twenty-six, the lyrical content attributed to Drake's ongoing battle with depression.
Snow Brigade	4:21	Mew	A Danish alternative rock band, consisting of Jonas Bjerre (lead vocals), Johan Wohler (bass) and Silas Utke Graae Jørgensen (drums). From Frengers, their 3rd album, 1993. The title is a portmanteau of the words friend and stranger.
Rain	3:01	The Beatles	First released in June 1966 as the B-side of Paperback Writer. Both songs were recorded during the sessions for the album Revolver though neither appears on it
Waiting For The Sun	4:03	The Doors	From 1969, Morrison Hotel, their 5th. Waiting for the Sun is also the name of their 3rd studio album, released 1968.
Bring Me Sunshine	1:51	Morcambe & Wise	Written in 1966 by the composer Arthur Kent, with lyrics by Sylvia Dee. M&W adopted as their signature tune for their second BBC series, 1969
