	Food For Thought	4:10	UB40	First single from 1980 debut album, Signing Off.
	Backslop	2:33	Baby Earl & The Trinidads	
	Memphis Soul Stew	2:57	King Curtis	1967. This minor classic probably has secured his legacy.
	Kidney Stew Blues	2:58	Eddie "Cleanhead" Vinson	1947. Nicknamed Cleanhead after an incident in which his hair was accidentally destroyed by lye contained in a hair straightening product
	(Do The) Mashed Potatoes (Part 1)	1:51	Nat Kendrick And The Swans	Recorded by James Brown with his band in 1959 and released as a two-part single in 1960. For contractual reasons the recording was credited to "Nat Kendrick and the Swans." Has Carlton "King" Coleman on vocals
	Sugar Bee	2:35	Cleveland Crochet	1961, the first Cajun record to break into Billboard's top 100.
	Touch Me Tomato	4:01	The Jolly Boys	A mento band from Port Antonio, Jamaica who formed in 1945 and had great commercial success in the late 1980s and 1990s. Did a version of Rehab in 2010.
	Dixie Chicken	3:59	Little Feat	1973, from 3rd album 'Dixie Chicken'. The country group The Dixie Chicks took their name from this song.
	Mean Mr. Mustard	1:07	The Beatles	1969 from Abbey Road. It was written in India by Lennon who was inspired by a newspaper story about a miser who concealed his cash wherever he could in order to prevent people from forcing him to spend it.
	Cheese And Onions	2:38	The Rutles	From The Rutles, a soundtrack album to the 1978 telemovie All You Need Is Cash. The primary creative force of the Rutles music was Neil Innes, the sole composer and arranger of the songs.
	The Onion Song	2:57	Marvin Gaye & Tammi Terrell	About social consciousness. Peaked at no 9 in UK Singles chart in 1969, Tammi Terrell died just a few months later from a brain tumor at age of 24.
	Chicken Grease	4:37	D'Angelo	From his second album, Voodoo, released 2000. Recorded at Electric Lady Studios, the Manhattan-based recording studio built by Jimi Hendrix.
	Friday Fish Fry	4:41	Kelis	From 2014 album, Food. Kelis Rogers Mora born 1979.
	Popcorn	2:33	Hot Butter	An early synthpop instrumental, written by German composer Gershon Kingsley in 1969 and first appearing on his album Music to Moog By. Hot Butter rerecorded it in 1972.
	Sugar Hiccup (12" Version)	3:38	Cocteau Twins	From 1983 EP Snowburst and Snowblind. Scottish rock band active from 1979 to 1997. The original members were singer Elizabeth Fraser, guitarist Robin Guthrie, and bassist Will Heggie.
	Chocolate Cake	4:02	Crowded House	From 1991 album Woodface. The song gained only moderate performance in the US, as it referred to Americans having an "excess of fat on your American bones".
	Pulling Mussels (From The Shell)	4:00	Squeeze	From 1980 album Argybargy. An "observation of the British working class" and "offers a series of detailed snapshots of the different walks of life on a seaside holiday.
	Green Onions	2:51	Byron Lee & The Dragonaires	Original 1962.
	Polk Salad Annie	2:59	Elvis Presley	Written by Tony Joe White. Polk or poke sallet, is a cooked greens dish made from pokeweed. This from 1972 Elvis: As Recorded at Madison Square Garden
	Fisherman's Blues	4:23	Waterboys	From album of same name, 1988, their best selling. They changed their rock sound for a mixture of traditional Irish and Scottish music.
	Beans And Cornbread	2:49	Louis Jordan	From 1981, beans and cornbread was also the traditional meal served to NASA launch crews following a successful space shuttle launch. This from 1949.
	Peanut Vendor	2:07	Alvin 'Red' Tyler	A Cuban song based on a street-seller's cry, and known as a pregón. It is possibly the most famous piece of music created by a Cuban musician. Used in the fifth episode of season two of the TV series Breaking Bad.
	Watermelon Man	2:28	Mongo Santamaria	Ramón "Mongo" Santamaría Rodríguez (1917 – 2003) was a rumba quinto master (smallest and highest pitched type of conga drum) and an Afro-Cuban Latin jazz percussionist. A jazz standard written by Herbie Hancock, 1962.
	Life Is a Minestrone	4:42	10cc	Peaked at no 7 in 1975, released as the lead single from The Original Soundtrack album. Written by Lol Creme and Eric Stewart.
	Sliced Tomatoes	2:23	The Just Brothers	Brothers Jimmy and Frank Bryant. This was a dancefloor hit in 1972, and was sampled in Fatboy Slim's "The Rockafeller Skank".
	Sugar Baby Love	3:29	The Rubettes	1974, their debut single and only chart topper. Lead vocals by Paul Da Vinci.
	Banana Splits	1:56	The Dickies	Original was theme song for the children's television program The Banana Splits Adventure Hour, 1968. This version reached #7 in the UK Singles Chart in 1979.
	I can't go back to savoury now	4:24	John Shuttleworth	From 2008 album The Dolby Decades.
