	September	3:36	Earth Wind & Fire	1978, recorded during 'I Am' sessions (Boogie Wonderlad). Sold over a million copies
	Take Out Some Insurance	2:20	Jimmy Reed	A major player in the field of electric blues. Had a significant impact on many rock and roll artists who followed, such as Elvis Presley, Billy Gibbons and The Rolling Stones.
	Don't Say Tomorrow	2:31	The Prisonaires	Group was incarcerated in the Tennessee State Penitentiary in Nashville
	For A Spanish Guitar	5:01	Gene Clark	A founding member of The Byrds. From 1971, on his second solo album. Received critical acclaim upon its release, but only achieved commercial success in the Netherlands, where rock critics also voted it album of the year.
	Guitar Town	2:36	Steve Earle	1986, opening track on his debut album
	If I Were A Carpenter	3:01	Johnny Cash	Written by Tim Hardin in 1967, this duet by Johnny Cash and June Carter from 1970.
	Dixie Chicken	3:57	Little Feat	1973, from 3rd album.
	Teenage Head	2:53	Flamin' Groovies	From their third studio album, released in 1971. Released the same year as the Rolling Stones' classic album Sticky Fingers.
	Everything Is Broken	3:15	Bob Dylan	From his 1989 album, Oh Mercy.
	Burlesque	4:06	Family	Formed in Late 1966 in Leicester, shortly after joined by Ric Grech and Roger Chapman.
	Morning Dew	3:42	Duanne and Gregg Allman	Written by Tim Rose and Bonnie Dobson. Recorded 1968. Duane Allman was killed in a motorcycle accident in 1971.
	I Walk on Gilded Splinters	2:32	Cher	Cherilyn Sarkisian. Was married to Gregg 1975-1979. 1969 on album 3614 Jackson Highway which was the address of Muscle Shoals Sound Studios.
	The Comedians	3:26	Roy Orbison	From album 'Mystery Girl', recorded 1988 shortly before his death in December of that year and released the following year. 25th Anniversary. Written by Elvis Costello.
	Domino	3:12	Van Morrison	Opening track of his fourth studio album, His Band and the Street Choir. His tribute to New Orleans R&B singer and pianist Fats Domino. 69 last week.
	Take Me I'm Yours	2:51	Squeeze	1978, from first album 'Squeeze'. 57 on same day (31 August) as Van.
	Life During Wartime	3:41	Talking Heads	First single from their 1979 album Fear of Music. The song is also performed in the 1984 film Stop Making Sense
	Use Me	5:06	Grace Jones	Nightclubbing is her fifth studio album, released in 1981, the greatest commercial triumph of her entire career. Song originally recorded by Bill Withers, and was included on his 1972 album Still Bill.
	Finally	3:43	Ce Ce Peniston	1991. Requested by Aretha Franklin at her private birthday party, Pope John Paul II in Rome at the Vatican (as a member of the gospel band Sisters of Glory) and Bill Clinton, during both of his inauguration ceremonies in Washington, D.C.
	U Can't Touch This	3:06	M.C. Hammer	Stanley Kirk Burrell. Mostly known for this and his Hammer pants. Rick James shared songwriting credits because the song samples the prominent opening riff of "Super Freak"
	Dr. Goldfoot And The Bikini Machine	2:22	The Supremes	Title song from an 1965 comedy film starring Vincent Price and Frankie Avalon. About a mad scientist who builds a gang of female robots who are then dispatched to seduce and rob wealthy men.
	Magic Touch	2:51	The Bobby Fuller Four	Northern soul stomper from the same Bobby Fuller Four who had a hit with I fought the law.
	The September of My Years	2:57	Frank Sinatra	From Sinatra at the Sands, a 1966 live album, accompanied by Count Basie and his orchestra, conducted and arranged by Quincy Jones.
