	Cast Your Vote	2:27	Bobby Hendricks	1959 on Sue Records. He was a member of The Swallows, The Flyers, and sang lead with The Drifters before becoming a successful solo act (he sang The Drifters' "Drip Drop").
	Backslop	2:33	Baby Earl & The Trinidads	
	The Kid From Red Bank	2:42	Count Basie	1958 'Atomic Basie' album. Basie was born in Red Bank, New Jersey 1904
	Mellow Yellow	3:39	Donovan	Reached No. 8 in the UK in early 1967. In an interview with NME magazine he stated: "it's about being cool, laid-back, and also the electrical bananas that were appearing on the scene"
	The Green Manalishi (With The Two Pronged Crown)	4:36	Fleetwood Mac	Written by Peter Green and released as a single in 1970. He has always maintained that the song is about money, as represented by the devil.
	It's All Over Now, Baby Blue	3:26	Joan Baez	Written and original performed by Bob Dylan and featured on his 1965 album Bringing It All Back Home. Baez is widely considered to be the 'Baby Blue' he had in mind, who covered it the same year.
	Baby Blue	3:23	The Beach Boys	From L.A. (Light Album), their 23rd studio album, released on March 19, 1979.
	Purple Haze	3:15	Johnny Jones & the King Casuals	Was originally named 'The King Kasuals', was founded in 1962 by Jimi Hendrix and bassist Billy Cox. Johnny Jones led the band, circa 1964, replacing Hendrix
	Little Red Rooster	2:54	Sam Cooke	Howlin' Wolf recorded "The Red Rooster" in 1961, written by Willie Dixon. This version 1963, with young Billy Preston on organ
	Goodbye Yellow Brick Road	3:13	Elton John	Title track from his 7th album, released in 1973. It went on to sell over 30 million copies worldwide.
	(The Angels Wanna Wear My) Red Shoes	2:50	Elvis Costello	From his debut album, My aim is True, 1977.
	Orange Crush	3:53	R.E.M.	First single from the band's sixth studio album, Green, in 1988. The song's title is a reference to the chemical defoliant Agent Orange used in the Vietnam War.
	Little Red Corvette	4:57	Prince	1983, from the album 1999. Backing vocals were done by Lisa Coleman, one half of Wendy and Lisa.
	Red Light Spells Danger	3:31	Billy Ocean	1977, reached no 2. Born Leslie Sebastian Charles, 1950 in Trinidad
	Big Yellow Taxi	2:15	Joni Mitchell	1970, and released on Ladies of the Canyon album. "Took all the trees, put 'em in a tree museum, charged the people a dollar and a half just to see 'em" refers to Foster Gardens, a place in Waikiki which is basically a tree museum.
	Bullet The Blue Sky	4:32	U2	Fourth track from their 1987 album - 30th anniversary of the album. The Joshua Tree. Inspired by a trip that Bono made to Nicaragua and El Salvador, where he saw firsthand how local peasants were affected by US intervention in the region.
	99 Red Balloons	3:52	Nena	99 Luftballons (direct translation is Ninety-Nine Air Balloons), an anti-war protest song by the German band Nena from their 1983 self-titled album.
	Little Green Bag	3:24	George Baker Selection	1969 song written by Dutch musicians, Jan Visser and George Baker. Original title was "Little Greenback" - but was misprinted as the more familiar title. However, "little greenback" is the actual lyrical phrase sung throughout the track
	Blue	2:22	Elastica	From 1995 debut album Elastica. It became a number one album, becoming, at the time, the fastest-selling debut since Oasis' Definitely Maybe the previous year.
	Green Green Grass Of Home	2:41	John Otway	Having been dropped by Polydor, Otway went to Stiff Records. His first release with them came in October 1980 and was this cover of the Tom Jones hit.
	Voice Your Choice	2:35	The Radiants	1964, on Chess Records.
