	Don't Be Angry	2:23	Nappy Brown	Napoleon Brown Goodson Culp, born 1929 in Charlotte, North Carolina and died 2008 in Charlotte, North Carolina. Released it in 1955
	Total Destruction to Your Mind	3:25	Swamp Dogg	Jerry Williams, Jr., born 1942, Portsmouth, Virginia. In 1970 he took on the persona of "Swamp Dogg" and released his first LP record - this the title track.
	Bad To The Bone	4:56	George Thorogood & The Destroyers	1982. Can be traced back to Bo Diddley's song "I'm a Man", which uses a similar guitar riff and vocal rhythm
	The Intro And The Outro	3:05	Bonzo Dog Doo-Dah Band	Appears on their debut album, Gorilla (1967)
	Walk Tall	2:34	Val Doonican	1964, his first single, and it made top 10. Born 1928, the youngest of the 8 children.
	Sally, Go 'round The Roses	3:05	The Jaynetts	1963 hit, a Bronx-based one-hit wonder girl group. Inspired from the nursery rhyme "Ring Around the Rosie"
	All Men Are Liars	3:24	Nick Lowe	From album 'Party of One', 1990. His eighth album, produced by the Welsh musician, Dave Edmunds. On Reprise records
	Whole Wide World	3:00	Wreckless Eric	1977 on Stiff Records. Produced by, and featured bass guitar (and most of the other instruments) by Nick Lowe.
	Back in the Night	3:18	Dr. Feelgood	1975, appeared on their second album, Malpractice. Written by Wilko Johnson.
	Boat That I Row	2:40	Neil Diamond	1967. He considered this his first "Rebel Song," and it reflected his growing independence. Saying, go in the direction it takes you, even if it doesn't follow the standard routes.
	Wondrous Place	2:26	Billy Fury	Original version was released in the US by Jimmy Jones. Sung by Ronald Wycherley in 1960 and made 25 in the charts.
	(I'm Not Your) Steppin' Stone [Single Version]	2:23	The Monkees	Written by Tommy Boyce and Bobby Hart. It was first recorded by Paul Revere & the Raiders in 1966. This version from late that same year. Only Monkee featured is Micky Dolenz (lead vocal), along with Boyce (backing vocal) and Hart (organ)
	Time Of The Season	3:33	The Zombies	Featured on their 1968 album Odessey and Oracle, written by keyboard player Rod Argent and recorded at Abbey Road Studios in August 1967.
	I'm A Man	2:57	The Spencer Davis Group	Co-written by Steve Winwood, released 1967
	Hot Pants	3:11	James Brown	Sampled by Eric B. & Rakim on the track Paid in Full. The lyrics are an ode to the captivating power of the title garment, which members of the band first saw on their 1970 European tour.
	Float On	4:16	Floater	One of the biggest singles of 1977 - number 1 at time of Elvis's death. 'Way Down' succeeded it as number 1.
	Water	2:21	Geno Washington	Born William Francis Washington. In US Air Force during the early 1960s and stationed in East Anglia. Played some gigs in London, this a moderate hit in 1966.
	Here I Go Again	2:09	Archie Bell and the Drells	
	Love Don't Go Through No Changes On Me	3:20	Sister Sledge	1974.
