	Under My Thumb	3:11	Wayne Gibson	First released in 1966, never a hit until it became well known on the Northern soul club scene in 1974
	Gimme Shelter	3:33	Merry Clayton	Featured in 20 Feet from Stardom, the Oscar-winning documentary about background singers. On original version of song from 1969.

	Don't Worry Baby	2:48	Los Lobos	Spanish for "The Wolves". 1989, from How Will the Wolf Survive?, their major label debut album
