Rip It Up	5:12	Orange Juice	Second single to be released from their 1982 album of the same name.
Backslop	2:33	Baby Earl & The Trinidads	
Love My Way	3:34	Psychedelic Furs	1982, from their third studio album, Forever Now. Written by the four members of the group and produced by Todd Rundgren (who also played marimba on the song)
Papa's Got A Brand New Pigbag	3:37	Pigbag	The title being a clear pun on James Brown's song. Played Rag Week in spring of 1982.
Living On The Ceiling	3:45	Blancmange	Singer Neil Arthur. Band's 3rd single in 1982, taken from their debut album Happy Families - their biggest hit.
Waiting For A Train	3:40	Flash And The Pan	An Australian new wave musical group. Did original of "Walking in the Rain", which was later covered by Grace Jones. This reached number 7 on the UK Singles Chart in 1983.
This Time (We'll Get It Right)	2:45	England World Cup Squad	Written by Chris Norman & Pete Spencer of Smokie. 1982 World Cup in Spain.
Back of Love	3:15	Echo & The Bunnymen	Got to No. 19 in 1982. Produced by Ian Broudie under the pseudonym Kingbird
Party Fears Two	4:06	The Associates	1982, featuring the unique voice of singer Billy Mackenzie, committed suicide 17 years ago
Let's Dance	4:10	David Bowie	Title song from his 1983 album, went on to become one of his biggest-selling singles. Produced by Nile Rodgers.
(This Is Not A) Love Song	4:11	Public Image Ltd	1983. It's the group's biggest commercial hit, peaking at number 5
Favourite Shirts (Boy Meets Girl)	3:07	Haircut 100	From debut album Pelican West, 1982.
The Love Cats	3:40	The Cure	1983, the band's first Top 10 hit in the UK
Sharp Dressed Man	4:15	ZZ Top	From their album Eliminator released in 1983. Billy Gibbons, Dusty Hill and Frank Beard
Two Tribes	3:23	Frankie Goes To Hollywood	Entered at the number one position on 10 June 1984. Lyrics were inspired by US president Ronald Reagan's belief that Christ would return after a nuclear war. Trevor Horn produced this track.
Asylums In Jerusalem	3:12	Scritti Politti	Described as "a slick piece of reggae-tinged synth-pop with a twangy electronic bass line and a new playfulness in Green Gartside's politically motivated lyrics" From 1982, Songs to Remember album
Walking On Sunshine	3:31	Rockers Revenge Feat. Donnie Calvin	A studio musical project, assembled by producer with arrangements and production by Arthur Baker. This from 1982, written Eddy Grant
The Message	3:13	Grandmaster Flash & The Furious Five	Released as a single by Sugar Hill Records in 1982
Temptation	3:04	Heaven 17	
Let's Groove	4:02	Earth, Wind & Fire	A post-disco and funk song from October 1981 from album Raise!
Last Night A DJ Saved My Life	4:07	Indeep	1982, features vocals from Réjane "Reggie" Magloire and Rose Marie Ramsey. Rolling Stone magazine declared the song one of the greatest songs ever written about being a girl listening to the radio
I'll Find My Way Home	4:30	Jon & Vangelis	Written by Jon Anderson and Vangelis for 1981 album The Friends of Mr Cairo.
