	Jackie Wilson Said (I'm in Heaven When You Smile)	3:01	Van Morrison	
	Baby Workout	3:02	Jackie Wilson	Known as "Mr. Excitement", Wilson was important in the transition of rhythm and blues into soul. 1963, one of his biggest hits.
	Captain Scarlet	1:52	The Barry Gray Orchestra	First broadcast on ATV Midlands in September 1967. Actor Francis Matthews, who was the voice of Captain Scarlet died at the age of 86. He also played private detective Paul Temple in the BBC series from 1969.
	Double Dutch	4:42	Malcolm McLaren	1983 single, from his debut album Duck Rock. The follow-up to the successful debut single, "Buffalo Gals". The song concerns the skipping game of the same name.
	A Forest	4:55	The Cure	Released as a single from the band's second album Seventeen Seconds in April 1980.
	Perfect Skin	3:10	Lloyd Cole And The Commotions	From Rattlesnakes, their debut album and was released in 1984. The title reference to the novel Play It As It Lays by Joan Didion.
	The Official Colourbox World Cup Theme (7" version)	3:09	Colourbox	Initially intended as a FIFA World Cup anthem 1986 in Mexico. Had an international hit in 1987 with "Pump Up the Volume", under the name M/A/R/R/S
	goo goo muck	3:07	The Cramps	From 1981 album, Psychedelic Jungle. Their second.
	Cecilia	2:55	Simon & Garfunkel	From 1970 album Bridge Over Troubled Water, title refers to St. Cecilia, the patron saint of music.
	Go to the Mardi Gras	2:47	Professor Longhair	Henry Roeland "Roy" Byrd, December 1918 – January 1980
	Ay-Te Te Fee	2:40	Clifton Chenier	His first single for the Specialty record label, "Ay Tete Fille (Hey, Little Girl)," a cover of a Professor Longhair tune, released in May 1955.
	Roosevelt And Ira Lee (Night Of The Moccasin)	3:05	Tony Joe White	Touring early July
	You Never Can Tell	2:43	Chuck Berry	Composed in the early 1964s while Berry was in federal prison for allegedly violating the Mann Act - transporting a prostitute across state borders
	You Ain't Nothin' But Fine	1:41	Rockin' Sidney	Sidney Simien, 1938 – 1998. This from early 60s
	Immigrant Song	2:27	Led Zeppelin	From Led Zeppelin III, 1970. Written during Led Zeppelin's tour of Iceland, Bath and Germany in that summer. Lyrics make explicit reference to Viking conquests and the Old Norse religion
	Far Far Away	3:38	Slade	Released in 1974 to promote the upcoming film titled Slade in Flame
	Ways to Be Wicked	3:29	Lone Justice	1985, singer Maria McKee. Written by Tom Petty and Mike Campbell.
	Hercules	4:12	Aaron Neville	Along with brothers Art, Charles and Cyril, known as The Neville Brothers. Recorded 1973 - problems with the pressing of the single meant that it never got a proper release
	Psychedelic Shack	3:53	The Temptations	From 1970 album, represents the Temptations' full-blown submergence into psychedelia.
	Summer in the City	2:42	The Lovin' Spoonful	1966. The song features a series of car horns during the instrumental bridge, starting with a Volkswagen Beetle horn.
	Have Love Will Travel	2:57	Richard Berry & The Pharoahs
